

DESIGN IN COLOUR

A modern bach in Taupō channels a sophisticated mid-century theme.

Parsonson Architects are known for their delightful use of colour, most especially on baches and country houses, where their earthy, intermediate colours work with, rather than against, the landscape.

At this new bach in Taupō, the front elevation is marked out in planes of Resene Cross Country, an earthy sort of green, and a custom-tinted Resene paint colour – a cool, slightly muddy grey-blue. (You could use Resene Sorrento.) Inside, the smoky grey-green tones of Resene Tom Thumb are complemented by Resene Eighth Blanc. It's bright, even cheerful – but still elegant.
