#### You will need:

- Length of square dressed timber (ours measured 42mm x 42mm)
- Paintbrush
- Pencil
- Resene Aquaclear satin
- Resene Colorwood testpots in Resene Apollo Blue, Resene Desert Yellow, Resene Deep Purple, Resene **Emerald, Resene Red Pepper** and Resene Satin Orange

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- Saw
- Sandpaper
- Set square



# Step one

Measure, mark and cut the wood into 24 cubes. Smooth any rough edges with sandpaper.



#### Step two

Apply one coat of Resene Desert Yellow to four of the cubes and allow to dry.



#### Step three

Apply one coat of Resene Satin Orange to four of the cubes and allow to dry.



#### Step four

Apply one coat of Resene Red Pepper to four of the cubes and allow to dry.



# Step five

Apply one coat of Resene Emerald to four of the cubes and allow to dry.



# Step six

Apply one coat of Resene Apollo Blue to four of the cubes and allow to dry.



## Step seven

Apply one coat of Resene Deep Purple to four of the cubes and allow to dry.



## Step eight

Apply three coats of Resene Aquaclear satin to all the blocks, allowing two hours for each coat to dry.





# To get the look:

Mark painted the table with Resene **Enamacryl** tinted to Resene Woodstock.



# Other ideas:

Blocks could also be primed with Resene Quick Dry and then painted with Resene from testpots the KidzColour Resene range.
