Mastering the art of Christmas cakes

Christmas is a great time to recycle Christmas paper, if you can resist tearing it to shreds trying to release the present it’s hiding. We also thought it was a great time to recycle this interesting cake recipe, just don’t blame us if it, or you, are not presentable on Christmas Day...

Ingredients:

1 cup of water	Lemon juice
1 tsp baking soda	4 large eggs
1 cup of sugar	Lots of nuts
1 tsp salt	1 bottle brandy
1 cup of brown sugar	2 cups of dried fruit



Method:

Sample the brandy to check the quality.

Take a large bowl, check the brandy again to be sure it is the highest quality. Repeat.

Turn on the electric mixer. Beat one cup of butter in a large fluffy bowl.

Add one teaspoon of sugar. Beat again.

At this point it’s best to make sure the brandy is shtill OK.

Try another taste... just in case. Turn off the mixer.

Break 2 leggs and add to the bowl and chuck in the cup of dried fruit.

Pick fruit off floor.

Mix on the turner.

If the fried druit gets stuck in the beaters pry it loose with a sdrewsdriver.

Sample the brandy to check for tonsistency.

Next, sift two cups of salt.


roll into 2018, the whites and neutrals palettes will be updated too – keep an eye out for these at Resene ColorShops in the New Year.


