

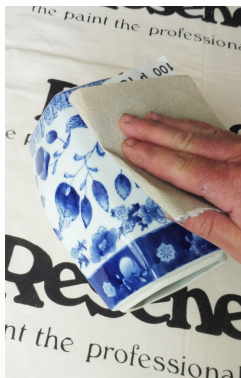

Resene art with Mark Rayner – 96

### You will need:

- Ceramic vase
- Clean cloth
- Paint stirrer
- Paintbrush
- Resene Blackboard Paint
- Resene Waterborne Smooth Surface Sealer
- Resene testpot of Resene Bright Spark
- Sandpaper



**Step one**  
Lightly sand the ceramic vase to 'key' the surface.



**Step two**  
Wipe off any sanding residue with a clean cloth.



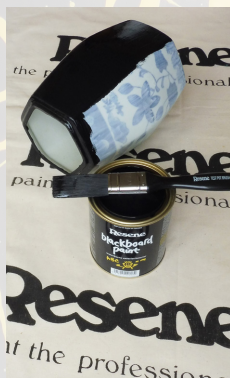
**Step three**  
Carefully stir the Resene Waterborne Smooth Surface Sealer.



**Step four**  
Apply one coat of Resene Waterborne Smooth Surface Sealer to the vase and allow to dry.



**Step five**  
Carefully stir the Resene Blackboard Paint.



**Step six**  
Apply one coat of Resene Blackboard Paint to the vase and allow to dry.



**Step seven**  
Apply a second coat of Resene Blackboard Paint to the vase and allow to dry.



**Step eight**  
Lightly splatter the vase with Resene Bright Spark and allow to dry.



**To get the look:**  
Mark painted the background wall with Resene SpaceCote Flat tinted to Resene Half Alabaster.



**Other ideas:**  
For a monochrome effect, paint the vase with Resene Alabaster and lightly splatter with Resene All Black.
