

# Resene COLOUR HOME FINALIST





t was partly the cost of painting a house that led to the dramatic colour scheme Tamsin Hanly chose for her Auckland villa. "I felt that if we were going to spend a significant amount of money repainting the house that we should be doing something active, confident, original and energetic," she says.



### Bright colour tips

- \* Colours look more intense when used on a larger area. If you are undecided between two colours, it's often best to go for the lighter one as it will look stronger in situ.
- \* Some bright colours have pigments in them that are more vulnerable to the effects of the sun. Applying a coat of clear Resene Sun Defier, formulated with U.V. inhibitors to prevent much of the sun's energy hitting the colour, can help colour look its best for longer.
- \* To keep the exterior of your home looking good, wash it every 6-12 months using water and a cleaner like Resene Paint Prep and Housewash. It will clean your house and minimise the need for repainting.
