You will need:

- Clean cloth
- Galvanised watering can
- Paint stirrer
- Paintbrush
- Potted colour (we used white chrysanthemums)
- Resene Galvo-Prime
- Resene Lumbersider tinted to **Resene Spritzer**
- Sandpaper



Step one Lightly sand the watering can to 'key' the surface.



Step two Wipe off any sanding residue with a clean cloth.



Step three Carefully stir the Resene Galvo-Prime.



Step four Apply one coat of Resene Galvo-Prime to the outside of the watering can and allow to dry.

For a rich red effect paint the watering can with Resene Lumbersider tinted to Resene Poppy.



Step five Carefully stir the Resene Lumbersider tinted to Resene Spritzer.



Apply one coat of Resene Lumbersider tinted to Resene Spritzer to the outside of the watering can and allow to dry.



Step seven Apply a second coat of Resene Lumbersider tinted to Resene Spritzer to the outside of the watering can and allow to dry.



Step eight Place the potted colour in the watering can.
