

★★★ Difficulty level ★easy ★★moderate ★★★challenging Resene kids art with Mark Rayner – 112



You will need:

- Paintbrushes
- Paper Mache mask (ours came from 'Spotlight')
- Resene Art Action gloss glaze
- Resene Art Action Quick Dry
- Resene testpots of Resene Fizz, Resene Kermit, Resene Mariner and Resene Rocket



Step one
Apply one coat of Resene Quick Dry to the mask and allow to dry for two hours.



Step two
Apply two coats of Resene Fizz to the mask, allowing two hours for each coat to dry.



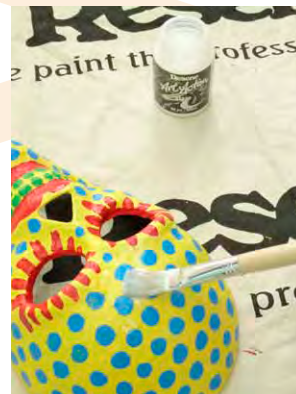
Step three
Paint eyelashes and lips with Resene Rocket and allow two hours to dry. Apply a second coat (if necessary) and allow to dry.



Step four
Paint teeth with Resene Kermit and allow two hours to dry.



Step five
Paint spots all over the rest of the mask with Resene Mariner. Allow two hours to dry.



Step six
To give the mask a shiny finish, apply one coat of Resene Art Action gloss glaze and allow to dry. Boy, that's spooky!



Top tip:

If you don't have a paper mache mask, simply make your own from cardboard, newspaper and PVA glue.
