### You will need:

- Paintbrushes (including a fine artists' brush)
- Paper maché pony (ours came from 'Spotlight')
- Resene Quick Dry
- Resene Testpots in the following colours: Resene Alabaster, Resene Burnt Umber, Resene Mai Tai, Resene Nero and Resene Sambuca



#### Step one

Apply one coat of Resene Quick Dry to the pony and allow two hours to dry.



#### Step two

Apply two coats of Resene Mai Tai to the pony, allowing two hours for each coat to dry.



#### Step three

Paint the pony's hooves with Resene Sambuca and allow to dry.



#### Step four

Paint the pony's eyes and nose with Resene Sambuca and allow to dry.



#### Step five

Paint the pony's mane with Resene Burnt Umber and allow to dry.



#### Step six

Paint the centre of each eye with a blob of Resene Nero and, once dry, paint a highlight in each eye with Resene Alabaster. Yeehaa!



### Top tip:

If you don't have a paper maché pony like this one, you can make your own from PVA glue and newspaper.



### Here's another idea:

Make your very own shiny Black Beauty using Resene Alabaster, Resene Sambuca and Resene Nero, finishing off with two coats of Resene Multishield+ gloss.
