- Clean cloth
- Paint stirrer
- Paintbrush
- Painted wooden chair
- Resene Lustacryl tinted to Resene St Kilda
- Resene Quick Dry
- Sandpaper



Step 1 Carefully remove the upholstered seat and back.



Step 2 Lightly sand the chair to 'key' the surface.



Step 3 Wipe off any sanding residue with a clean cloth.



Step 4 Carefully stir the Resene Quick Dry.





To get the look: Mark painted the background wall with Resene SpaceCote Flat tinted to Resene Egg Sour and Resene Chardonnay.



Other ideas: For a rich deep red effect paint the chair with Resene Lustacryl tinted to Resene Pohutukawa.

Step 5 Spot prime any areas of bare wood with Resene Quick Dry and allow to dry.



Step 6 Carefully stir the Resene Lustacryl tinted to Resene St Kilda.



Step 7 Apply one coat of Resene Lustacryl tinted to Resene St Kilda to the chair and allow to dry.



Step 8 Apply a second coat of Resene Lustacryl tinted to Resene St Kilda to the chair and allow to dry. Replace the upholstered seat and back.
