Ways with wood with Mark Rayner – 85

You will need:

- 1.5m fence paling
- 50mm x 25mm timber (approx 1.8m)
- 100mm x 75mm x 1200mm treated timber
- 65mm exterior screws
- Paint stirrer
- Paintbrush

- Pencil
- Resene Woodsman tinted to Resene Grey Green
- Sandpaper
- Saw
- Screwdriver
- Tape measure

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Step 1 Measure and mark three 450mm lengths of fence paling.



Step 2 Cut the lengths to size.



Step 3 Smooth any rough edges with sandpaper.



Step 4 From the 50mm x 25mm timber, measure, mark and cut two lengths at 470mm and two lengths at 410mm. Smooth any rough edges with sandpaper.



Step 5 Assemble the cut pieces of timber, as shown, to form the table top. Fix with 65mm screws.



Step 6 Position the remaining piece of timber in the centre of the table top, as shown, and fix from underneath with screws driven in at an angle.



Step 7 Carefully stir the Resene Woodsman tinted to Resene Grey Green.



Step 8 Apply two coats of Resene Woodsman tinted to Resene Grey Green to the feeding table, allowing the first coat to dry before applying the second.

Exterior

Keep your feathered friends happy with this easy-to-make bird feeding table.



To get the look: Mark painted the background shed wall with Resene Lumbersider tinted to Resene Soft Apple.



Other ideas: For a rich red effect stain the feeding table with Resene Woodsman tinted to Resene Japanese Maple.
