WALNUT WONDERS Draw up your animal ideas on paper, then have an adult carefully crack some clean walnuts in half – start with a knife at the soft end and carefully work it down. Give the walnuts an undercoat with a white base, like Resene White Pointer. We chose Resene Sambuca and Resene White Pointer for the hedgehog, Resene Pohutukawa for the ladybird, Resene Quarter Bokara grey for the mouse and Resene Half Spanish White for the rabbit. Once the base layer is dried, use a small brush to paint the details. We used Resene Alabaster and Resene Nero, as well as Resene Shabby Chic on the rabbit and mouse.
